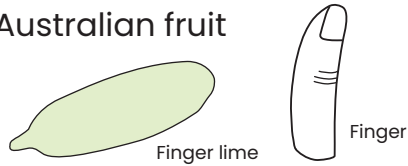


# Garden Kids

Finger limes are a tasty Australian fruit in the shape of a finger!

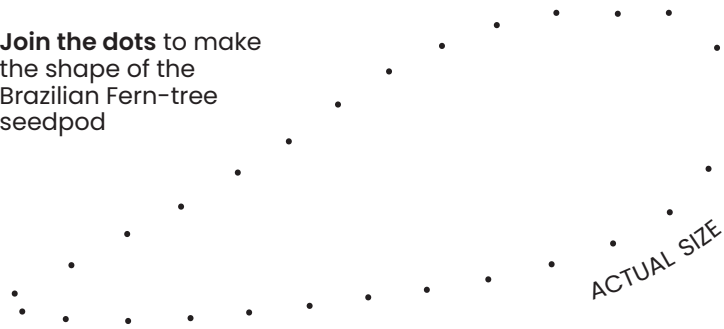
**Draw** around your little finger here, is your finger shorter or longer than a finger lime?

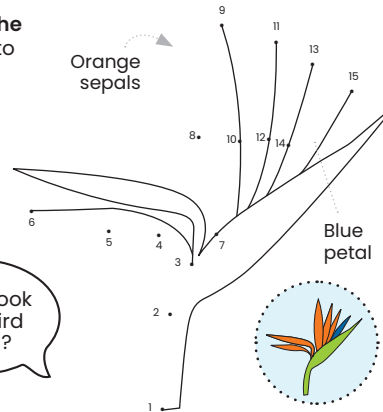


Circle what your face looked like!

Connect the numbers to draw the Bird of Paradise flower and colour it in.

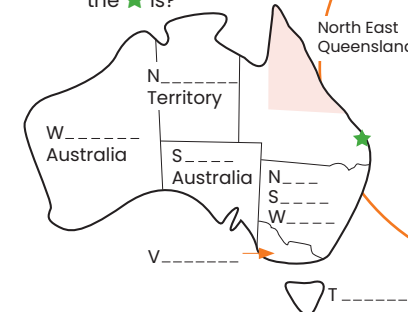


**3** Onionwood tree

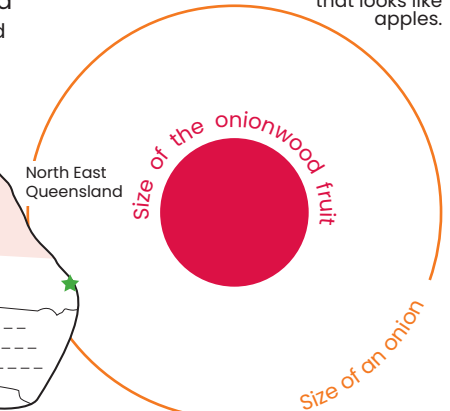
Onionwoods are from North Queensland

Can you **write** Bundaberg where the **\*** is?

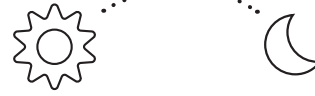


An Onionwood tree **doesn't** grow onions. Search for red fruit that looks like apples.



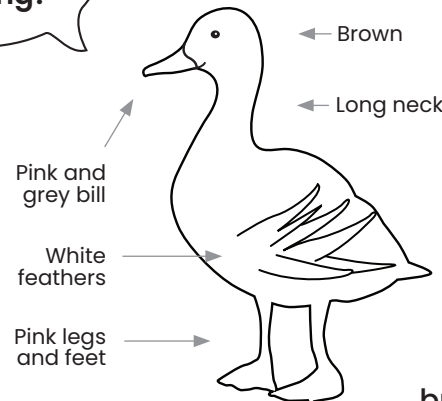
Have you spotted the Plumed Whistling ducks in the bottom lake?

**shhh!**

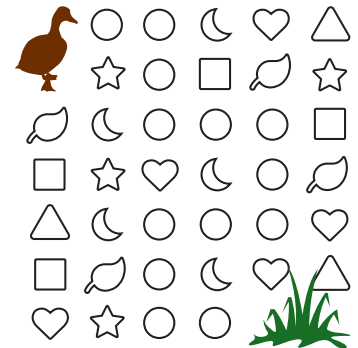
This is the way they talk to each other. **Their wings also whistle when flying.**
